SPMUD Taps Local Utility Exec for General Manager

(Rocklin, CA Nov 21, 2024) The Board of Directors of the South Placer Municipal Utility District (SPMUD) has appointed Eric Nielsen, P.E., to serve as the ninth General Manager of SPMUD.

Eric has worked for the District as the Superintendent for the last five years, and prior to that served as the District Engineer for six years. He has over nineteen years of water and wastewater engineering and operations experience. Eric has a Master of Science in Civil Engineering from Brigham Young University. He is a Professional Engineer, Certified Special District Manager, and has a California Water Environment Association, Collection System Maintenance Grade 4 Certification. Eric is a strong community leader who embraces innovation.

Eric is currently working on a large SCADA Improvement Project that will increase system resilience, helping to prevent costly system failures. He brings a commitment to continuing the SPMUD mission to Protect public health and the water environment, Provide efficient and effective sanitary sewer service, and Prepare for the future. Under Eric's leadership, the District will continue to serve District customers as a reliable, sustainable, efficient, cost-effective, and responsive community partner.

Nielsen takes the reigns from Herb Niederberger, the District's General Manager for the past 10 years. Under Niederberger's leadership, SPMUD was successful in providing exemplary sewer service to the residents of Rocklin, Loomis and parts of Placer County. SPMUD has won numerous awards from the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) for Financial Reporting and Budget Presentations as well as transparency awards from the Special District Leadership Foundation. In 2020, SPMUD won the California Water Environment Association's Collection System of the Year for medium sized systems. Niederberger retires after almost 50 years in the utility industry.
